# Pennies for Parking

Did you know that shoppers can pay just 10p for the first 10 minutes parking, then 5p for every 5 minutes thereafter?

The First for Access team, responsible for making it easier for customers to shop in town, have successfully persuaded London Borough of Bromley (LBB) to replace the confusing instructions on parking meters.

Revised signage will be installed over the coming weeks, clearly showing there is no need to pay for the full hour if you don't need it.

## | Pride in Orpington High Street

• We want to bring back good old fashioned values!

In the days gone past you can see how people took pride in their shops! Here's how you can make a difference;

- 1. First Impressions Keep your shop front clean and tidy (including your windows!)
- 2. Window dressing make it attractive and change it at least once a month to keep it interesting and engaging.
- I 3. Daily sweep don't wait for the street cleaning teams to come around!
- 4. Scrape off any chewing gum outside your shop don't let it build up.
- 5. Remove graffiti using the free graffiti kit available from LBB
- 6. Report it issues such as damaged bins, overhanging trees or damaged paving to www.fixmystreet.co.uk for immediate action.
- 7. Tidy A Board Only 1 A board is allowed per business abutted to your shop front with 2 metres clearance for customers to pass. Non compliance could result in removal of your A Board and possible enforcement action by LBB.

Do these simple tasks and you will see happy customers go in and profits go up!

### Tables and chairs on the pavement

- The charge is £7 per day on which you trade, irrespective of size.
- You must display your licence clearly in your shop window.

Tables and chairs or other goods on the footway without a licence will be treated as illegal Street trading and could lead to legal action by the London Borough of Bromley's enforcement team.

Application forms and licence fees can be found at www.bromley.gov.uk
We have negotiated a few weeks grace until the 31st August before the Council start enforcing the measures.

Charity shops represent just 4 per cent of the High Street stores and the articles completely fail to acknowledge the many exciting developments that promise to transform the town centre into a local hub for businesses and consumers – including the new Odeon Cinema complex,

the opening of a gleaming new library and the redevelopment of the Orpington campus of Bromley College. I would strongly urge businesses to pay no attention to these alarmist articles and continue investing in Orpington."
